

Youth Side-by-Side Class

This Class is aimed at our younger, giving them an introduction and opportunity to Offroad Racing as well as a class to race in after having outgrown the Kids Side-by-Side Class.

As with all racing, there are some rules and regulations to follow and ensure safe racing.

1 Eligibility

- 1.1 Youths aged from **13** to **17** years may enter this class.
- 1.2 All Competitors must hold a current NORA 92 Licence.
One Event Licences can be obtained at the Event.

2 Personal Safety Equipment

- 2.1 All competitors shall wear at all times during an event, a one-piece race suit as per Hammerking Rulebook V5.3
- 2.2 Flame/fire retardant gloves must be worn.
- 2.3 Footwear of a Flame/fire retardant material must be worn.
- 2.4 Proper crash/racing helmets as per Hammerking Rulebook V5.3 must be worn by all occupants.
- 2.5 Head and Neck restraints as per Hammerking Rulebook V5.3 must be worn by all occupants.
- 2.6 Shatter-resistant eye protection must be worn by all drivers/codrivers.

3 Vehicle safety and Regulations

- 3.1 **Rules as per Section 2 and Sections 7.1 – 7.4 of the 2023 Hammerking Rulebook V5.3 as well as the Ultra4 Europe Technical Bulletin released 13.03.2023 are applicable to all vehicles of this class, apart from the alterations listed herein.**
- 3.2 **All Side-by-Sides (SXS) / UTVs in this class must be fitted with an electronic speed limiting device set to 60 km/h. Max. speed for all vehicles of this class is restricted to 60 km/h.**
- 3.3 Vehicle Identification: All vehicles will race numbers clearly displayed on all four sides of the vehicle. **Youth Class – White Numbers with purple background (RAL 4006).**
- 3.4 All vehicles must be fitted with **TWO** Harness/Belt cutters. **ONE** on either side of the vehicle and fitted in a way that they are **easily located** and **readily accessible** from inside and outside the vehicle.

4 General Safety

- 4.1 **Track Access**
Strictly no personnel, other than signed on officials, are permitted on the track while any machinery is operating.
- 4.2 **Driving in the Paddock**
Driving in the paddock is permitted but must not exceed walking pace and occupants must always wear a helmet. Under no circumstances may the machine be driven by anybody other than the competitor or official event staff.
